1. ONE Campaign seeks to end extreme poverty and prevent diseases such as AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis by advocating and lobbying for the world's most underserved communities.
2. HeForShe, part of U.N. Women and launched by a famous Brown University alumnus, provides a systematic approach to mobilizing the drive for gender equality around the world.
3. The Born This Way Foundation seeks to create "a kinder and braver world" by empowering youth through mental health resources and other services that bestow a more positive environment for young people.
4. Established in 2007 by a South African actor and UN Messenger of Peace, The Africa Outreach Program connects community organizations on the continent with the tools they need to thrive.
5. Despite its Australian roots, Laughing Man Foundation brings Ethiopian beans to New York via the Laughing Man Cafe, which donates all of its profits to promoting progressive education and improved health standards throughout Ethiopia and beyond.
6. A Boston area native created Water.org, which seeks to "provide as many people as possible with access to clean water."
7. The Barefoot Foundation supports six schools in Colombia, helping more than 30,000 vulnerable children and their families by making education universal for children.
8. Just Keep Livin' Foundation focuses on providing fitness programs for youngsters from Texas to California, where they use cardio and games to encourage wellness, community service, and nutrition so that they will be dazed and confused no longer.
9. The BeyGOOD foundation highlights work from various charitable organizations and offers direct links to donation opportunities.
10. The Show Me Campaign seeks to give every child access to a quality education by partnering with other education-based programs such as Teach for America, Teach for All, Harlem Village Academies, and New Profit. Additionally, in 2015, the Show Me Campaign launched a 5-year campaign to reduce mass incarceration rates in the United States by investing in education, rehabilitation, and effective re-entry services.
